Sharing the Gospel Matthew 21:28-32

This Sunday the Gospel tells the Parable of the Two Sons. The story is of a man with two sons who told them to go work in the vineyard. The first son refused, but later obeyed and went. The second son initially expressed obedience, but actually disobeyed and refused to work in the vineyard.

We are reminded that words can be meaningless and promises empty if they are not followed by action. Jesus asks us to consider whether our words and actions are in agreement. A few small acts are worth more than many fine words.
